Childersburg Middle School holds an **annual meeting for all parents** of students grades 5-8. Parents are notified of this meeting through notices sent home by students, reminders on monthly school-wide calendars, and phone calls made through the automated phone system.  - a. Hold Open House events

- 3. Shall educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school
 - a. New teacher training at the district and school level
 - b. Professional development and training on various methods of communication

The **School-Parent-Student Compact** was developed through the efforts of parents and teachers. Input was gathered from parents, teachers, and students in order to create pledges related to academic achievement for each group. The compacts are distributed to all students at the beginning of the school year and are signed by all parties signifying a commitment to working as a partnership to ensure that all students are successful in school. The compacts are kept in the classroom for use during parent-teacher and/or student-teacher conferences. The compact will be reviewed annually by teachers and parents and updated as needed.

Annually, the Continuous Improvement Plan Committee meets to **review and evaluate** the plan. Parents serve on the committee to represent all of the parents in the school. A notice will be sent home to make parents aware that the plan is under review. If, after the plan is finalized and approved, a parent finds the plan to be unsatisfactory, they **have the right to submit their concerns in writing**. We value our parents' input, concerns, and involvement in the process of educating their child. Parent surveys are used to assess the needs of parents. From that, other workshops are developed to meet these needs using available resources. Parents are **encouraged to visit their child's classroom** (Meet Your Teacher Night, scheduled visits through the homeroom teacher, special programs, etc.) CMS has an open-door policy for parents wishing to assist by volunteering **in any capacity**.
